Chapter 7 of Praying the Bible

⇒ Before you connect with your prayer people this week, read chapter 7 of Praying the Bible.

This week there's not much to write about but there's a whole lot to do.

Whitney refers to chapter 7 as the most important part of the book. It's one of the shortest chapters in his book. But he calls it the most important. Why? Because the "doing" is the transformational action that brings about a life style of change. If we only read about how to do something but we never do it how will we ever know its potential. There are many great self-help books on the market but if an individual doesn't put into practice the check list for change, there won't be any. So, if you haven't started praying the psalms, start today. Start this week. Take the plunge. I suspect since you've been a part of our 40 Days of Prayer, you've already taken the plunge, but if you've hesitated for some reason, hesitate no more.

Variety is the spice of life, they say. Adding this method of prayer to your life is going to spice up your prayer life. I took the challenge. Now it's your turn. Take seven minutes to pray through a psalm and see what happens.

For our daily prayer challenges this week:

January 31: Read through Psalm 31, and 119; use these passages to speak to God.

February 1: Read through Psalm 1, 31, 61, 91, 121; use these passages to speak to God.

February 2: Read through Psalm 2, 32, 62, 92, 122; use these passages to speak to God.

February 3: Read through Psalm 3, 33, 63, 93, 123; use these passages to speak to God.

February 4: Read through Psalm 4, 34, 64, 94, 124; use these passages to speak to God.

February 5: Read through Psalm 5, 35, 65, 95, 125; use these passages to speak to God.

February 6: Read through Psalm 6, 36, 66, 96, 126; use these passages to speak to God.
